Date	228/7 BCE Period: 3rd century BCE --> second half --> after 229 BCE, liberation from Macedonian control Reasons: archon Notes: The "basileus A[- - -]" in l. 12 could have been Attalus I or Antigonos Doson; the latter may be the most probable.

On l. 9, the motion formula $\epsilon\tau\delta$ is emphasized by being centered and separated from the text body.

Physical features

Measurements: h: 0.267 * w: 0.265 * t: 0.098

State of conservation: The stone preserves the upper-left portion of the stele. Part of the left edge and of the pediment are preserved.

Legibility: A few letters are damaged or obliterated by some slight nicks.
